# Algebra II Coach Appel Procedures, Policies and Expectations

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#### Grades:

Assessments: 40%Classwork: 35%Homework: 10%Project: 10%

• Class Participation: 5%

All missing assignments will be deducted 10 points for the first 5 school days they are not submitted. Students will receive an additional 5 days to submit the assignment for a maximum of 50%. All assignments not submitted after 10 school days will results in a 0%.

# Tardies:

- Students are expected to be in their seat when the bell rings. If you are in the hallway when the bell rings, you are tardy.
- Students will be given a warning for their first tardy. Parents/guardians will be notified for a second tardy. School administrators will be notified for each tardy after that.

#### Absences:

- Being present for class is one of the strongest variables that correlates to higher grades. It is recommended that students try to schedule any appointments around class if possible.
- If a student has an excused absence, they will be given one day for each day absent to complete any missing work.
- Notes and homework keys for each lesson can be found on my website. It is the responsibility of the <u>student</u> to
  get the materials they missed and refer to these keys to learn the lesson. If the student has questions about the
  lesson, they should get an intervention pass from Coach Appel that following day.
- If a student is absent for a Quiz or Test, they should expect to take that assessment the day they return. If a student misses an assessment and a day or days leading up to the quiz/test, they will schedule a day to take the assessment with Coach Appel.

## Supplies:

- Pencil
- 1 ½' 3-ring binder
- Calculator (Graphing calculator is recommended, but not required).

### **Expectations:**

- Students will come to class prepared with all of the above supplies.
- Students will raise their hand before speaking aloud during class.
- Students should not disrupt the class by speaking to other students, getting up out of their seats without asking, or eating.
- Students should be engaged the entire class. No sleeping.
